#### **Project Overview**

The Great Plains Development Authority seeks funding from the U.S. Department of Interior for funding available through the WaterSMART Environmental Water Resources Projects program for their Great Plains Industrial Park/City of Parsons Emergency Water Connection project which involves installing 8 miles of water pipeline, rehabilitating a water tower, and enhancing fire suppression to improve system integration, increase storage capacity, and strengthen regional water resilience.

This opportunity is a discretionary IIJA program with a local match requirement of 25% of the total project cost. The entity is requesting \$1,413,263.70 from the Build Kansas Fund, and is providing a local match of \$74,382.30. This request has the potential to unlock \$4,462,938.00 in federal funds, for a total project cost of \$5,950,584.00.

The deadline is to be determined and this Build Kansas Fund application was received on January 31, 2025.

Describe your efforts Water infrastructure funding is needed due to Great Plains Development to find other available Authority's unique organizational structure and Great Plains Industrial Park's current operations. The Great Plains Development Authority is a quasi-municipal organization; however, it does not receive any government funding. Additionally, the Great Plains Industrial Park's water utility is not considered public so typical large funding sources from KDHE and EPA are not available to fund infrastructure. Economic Development funding is one of very few public funding sources GPDA can access to fund improvements to GPIP's water system established in 1942. EDA funding was utilized for a water improvement in 2018. Local funds are secured for the match requirement of this project.

### **Project Scope Statement**

**Project Title:** Water System Integration and Infrastructure Improvement

**Project Overview:** This project aims to install 8 miles of C900 PVC pipe to connect the water systems of the City of Parsons and the Great Plains Industrial Park (GPIP), enhancing infrastructure within GPIP. The majority of the pipes will be 12 inches in diameter to maximize capacity sharing between the City of Parsons and GPIP.

### **Key Components:**

## 1. Pipeline Installation:

- Install 8 miles of C900 PVC pipe.
- The majority of the pipe will be 12 inches in diameter.
- Conduct multiple borings under roads, a creek, and a rail line.

#### 2. Water Tower Rehabilitation:

- Rehabilitate Water Tower #1 at GPIP.
- o Increase GPIP's water storage capacity by 250,000 gallons.
- o Maintain pressure for both water systems.

### 3. Fire Suppression and Maintenance:

- o Install 18 hydrants for fire suppression service.
- o Install 11 isolation valves for ease of maintenance.


### 4. System Integration:

- o Install a bilateral valve and vault at the junction of both systems.
- Ensure that either system can supply the other with domestic water service when necessary.
